


WINE RECOMMENDATION



Fife Vineyards

2005 L'Attitude 39 (Mendocino)

Let me start with an observation about what this wine does NOT have... *Attitude!* In my opinion, that is all for the good. If you want oenological arrogance and show-off flavors, look elsewhere.

This is a well crafted and modest wine. Not a "little" wine, but rather an understated, interesting wine to explore and "get to know" over the course of a meal. There's a nice meld of berries, tobacco, and earth here - a Rhone-style chorus singing over a soft continuo of tannins and restrained alcohol.

With these varietals sourced from the Mendocino hills, perhaps the wine would be better named *Attitude!*. Whatever the name, it is a real treat to find wines like this for a mere twenty bucks. You'd pay three times as much for real *Attitude!*!
